CPS Makes Full FY 2015 Payment

Thanks in large part to RTAC members who lobbied for full funding, the Chicago Public Schools (CPS) completed its pension payment for Fiscal Year 2015 on June 30. Employer contributions for 2015 were approximately \$681 million following a \$585 million contribution in 2014. The Board of Education subsequently engaged the Chicago Teachers' Pension Fund (CTPF) Trustees in discussions regarding a possible payment plan for FY 2016-17. RTAC opposed this, and discussions ended shortly thereafter. A payment of \$675 million is due for 2016. RTAC continues to insist on full funding.

Legislative Update

This past spring and summer RTAC focused efforts on persuading Illinois legislators to pass HB 3695. The bill would reinstate the pension levy which provided funding for CTPF until 1995 when the funds were diverted to the CPS budget.

Representative Marcus C. Evans, Jr., (D-Chicago) introduced HB 3695, and House Speaker Michael J. Madigan and Majority Leader Barbara Flynn Currie signed on as Chief Co-Sponsors after lobbying from RTAC. Other co-sponsors included John D'Amico (D-Chicago), David Harris (R-Mt. Prospect), Anthony DeLuca (D-Chicago Hts.), Camille Y. Lilly (D-Chicago), Christian L. Mitchell (D-Chicago), Elgie R. Sims, Jr. (D-Chicago). Joe Sosnowski (R-Rockford), and Arthur Turner (D-Chicago).

VOTE for RTAC Endorsed CTPF Trustee Candidates

Wednesday, June 3, 2015, the RTAC Executive Board, Directors, and Past Presidents interviewed six Chicago Teachers' Pension Fund (CTPF) Pensioner Trustee Candidates. RTAC's Board voted to endorse three candidates: Ivry J. Hobbs, Patricia Kubistal, and Mary Sharon Reilly. All candidates will work to maximize CTPF's resources and secure the most appropriate health insurance options for our membership. CTPF will mail ballots to all eligible pensioners in mid-October. Completed ballots must be postmarked on or before November 6, 2015. We urge you to vote for the RTAC endorsed candidates.



IVRY J. HOBBS Ivry J. Hobbs' career extended from the classroom to the principalship during a full CPS career. Hobbs also served as a CTU delegate and taught at Northeastern Illinois University. Following his retirement, he completed his Doctorate in Education at Loyola University-Chicago. In retirement, Hobbs continues to be active in a variety of professional and civic organizations.



PATRICIA KUBISTAL During her extended CPS career, Patricia Kubistal developed a wide range of expertise in school administration, finance, federal, and state regulations. She completed her doctorate and served as a university professor at four local universities. In 2015, Kubistal joined RTAC as a Director, and currently serves as chair of the insurance committee. As a CTPF trustee representing

Mary Sharon Reilly had a full CPS career during which she served as a school counselor and CTU delegate. She represented active CTPF members as a trustee from 1991 to 2002, and she served as President of the CTPF Board of Trustees from 1993 to 2002. Reilly has served as Pensioner Trustee for the past 8 years, and serves on several CTPF committees.

On April 14, 2015, the Illinois House passed HB 3695 with bi-partisan support. The legislation then moved to the Illinois Senate where Senator Mattie Hunter (D-Chicago) served as the chief sponsor.

Unfortunately, HB 3695 stalled in the Senate. RTAC lobbyists have indicated that there is still a possibility that HB 3695 might proceed during the fall 2015 veto session. Please contact your Illinois State legislators and urge them to support HB 3695.


RTAC: a History of Advocacy

RTAC's history of advocacy and representation of the rights and interests of CPS educators dates to its founding in 1926. That year, a small group of people led by educator James E. Armstrong organized to challenge the Chicago Board of Education's 1925 Emeritus Rule. This rule involuntarily dismissed teachers over the age of 70 without pension guarantees. The group sued the Chicago Board of Education on the grounds that the Board did not have the power to make rules which would have the effect of law.

Thanks to the efforts of these members, the Emeritus Rule was overturned. Their efforts also laid the groundwork for the enactment of the Miller Law. This landmark legislation provided for scheduled retirements and established a minimum pension to be paid to CPS retirees.

Realizing that there was strength in numbers, the group began holding social events and conducting outreach to fellow educators, establishing a membership program and eventually opening an office downtown. RTAC was incorporated as a not-for-profit corporation in 1951 and was one of the founding/charter members of the National Retired Teachers Association. Highlights from our history include:

James E. Armstrong, RTAC founder

1966: Initiated two-year term of office for the RTAC President.

1981: Sponsored the election of the first Pensioner Trustee on the Chicago Teachers' Pension Fund Board of Trustees. Edna C. Fanning was elected to represent Pensioners on the CTPF Board of Trustees.



Edna C. Fanning served as RTAC President 1981-1982 and was the first elected CTPF Pensioner Trustee.

2012: Defeated a proposed amendment to the Illinois Constitution which would have compromised all Illinois public agency retirees' annual cost of living increases.



2012: Achieved success in a sevenyear legal battle which protected the pensions of 3,600 CTPF members who were threatened when CPS tried to recover pension payments.



1926: Opened an office at 185 N. Wabash Ave., with the Chicago Principals Club.

1926: First membership luncheon at "The Top of the Town" Restaurant in Chicago.

1941: Published MEMOS, a communication which provided a record of the organization's activities for members.

1945: Began producing the RTAC *News Bulletin* with Charles S. Winslow as editor.



1947: Moved to an independent office at 220 South State St.



Ethel Percy Andrus the founder of AARP

1947: Worked with Dr. Ethel Percy Andrus of AARP to establish the National Retired Teachers Association. RTAC holds a charter membership.

1951: RTAC organized as a not-for-profit corporation.

1986: Incorporated the Chicago Retired



Teachers Aid Fund, Inc., (see www.crtaf.org), a notfor-profit corporation which provides grants-in-aid to qualified CTPF pensioners with diminutive household incomes.

FROM THE DESK OF THE PRESIDENT

The comments of Charles A. Burbridge, the new Executive Director CTPF emphasized the continued need for each of us to ensure that "We do not repeat the mistakes of the past." Ralph Martire, the Executive Director of the Center for Budget and Tax Accountability, asked us to rethink the solutions needed to protect our pensions.

Taken together, these comments provide a challenge to all pensioners to remain alert to the actions of our legislators, CPS and the City of Chicago as they attempt to solve their real financial problems.

The task that faces us is to never permit them to solve these problems by destroying the integrity of our pensions.

Our past actions were often fruitful as we prevented State Constitutional changes which would remove pension security by sanctioning 'pension holidays' and reduced pension contributions

But this fight continues and each of us must accept and take an active role. This past spring and summer I traveled to Springfield on two occasions representing the interests of RTAC members. I attended a hearing on HB 3695 on March 19. The legislation

restoring our tax levy received bi-partisan support in the House, but unfortunately was not called for a vote in the Senate. We hold out a hope that this fall we can again attempt to move HB 3695, and your voice will undoubtedly play an important role.

I returned to Springfield on July 28 as a member of a panel offering testimony about the devastating impact of Governor Rauner's pension proposal.

Advocacy is a responsibility we all share, so please do your part. Watch for RTAC news, bring in new members, and finally be an advocate for your pension.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE

As we approach RTAC's 90th anniversary in 2016, we are reviewing the materials which have been left to us by our predecessors. When we relocated from our prior office at 20 E. Jackson Blvd., we discovered two small notebooks which document the activities of the RTAC Service Committee in 1973.

The information contained therein revealed that the committee members focused upon assisting retired CPS educators who needed guidance and support with financial, housing, medical, and transportation issues during their retirements. The Service Committee members would carefully investigate the circumstances in which some of their former colleagues found themselves. They would then request that the RTAC Board provide small stipends to assist those retired educators whom they identified as being in need. This is what eventually led to the establishment of our Chicago Retired Teachers Aid Fund, Inc. (CRTAF) which was incorporated in 1986. At the time of its establishment, CRTAF was incorporated as a 501 (c) (3) not-for-profit charitable organization which enables

it to accept tax deductible donations in accordance with the law and to disburse funds in accordance with the regulations governing charitable entities.

It was interesting to discover that the first major donation was a legacy bequest in the amount of \$50,000 from Ms. Ferol Potter who served as RTAC's President in the biennium 1975-76. As we celebrate our nine decades of service to our retired Chicago public school educators, it is fitting and appropriate to recall the generosity of those who have preceded us and to commit ourselves to maintaining their legacy into the future.


